

The group's investment capacity typically ranges from \$100,000 to \$350,000 (sometimes more) and look at participating in subsequent financing rounds (follow-on investment). Furthermore, they consider syndication opportunities with other angel investors, other commercialization partners and early-stage venture capital funds. Since inception in 2012, the members of GAN have invested over \$20 million in 75 different companies.
