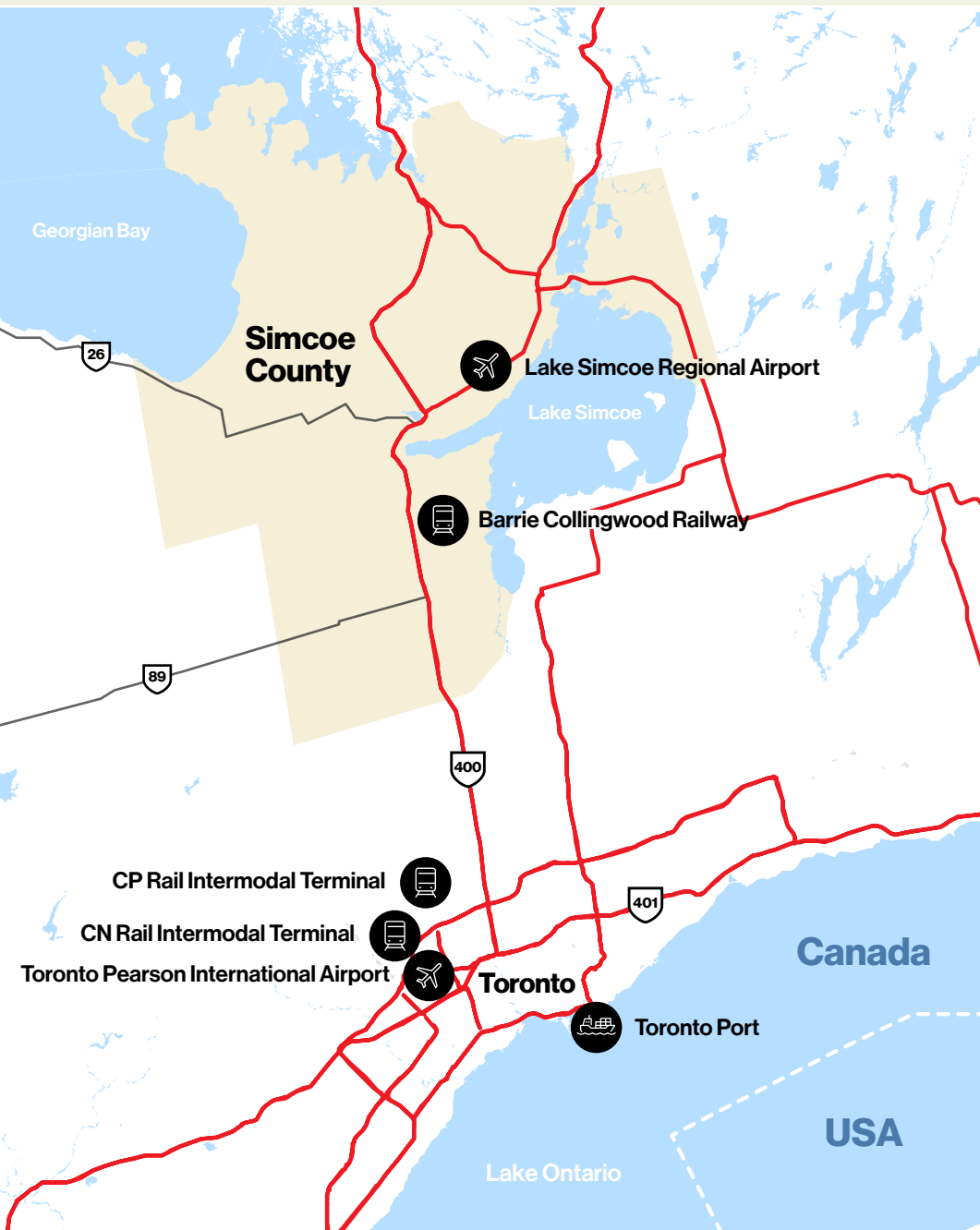


Easy access to major North American markets

Highways

Highway 400, a three-lane controlled-access highway, runs the length of Simcoe County, allowing for easy movement of goods and services and a quick connection to Highway 401, an essential artery in the movement of goods across Canada and into the northern U.S.



Ports

Proximate to the largest ports on Lake Ontario (Port of Toronto, Port of Hamilton and Port of Oshawa), Simcoe County features easy access to critical domestic and international transportation systems, as well as the Atlantic Ocean via the St. Lawrence Seaway. This waterway to the world provides key transportation, distribution, storage and container services.

Airports

With convenient highway access and no urban encroachment, Lake Simcoe Regional Airport is a 24/7 operation and a Canada Border Services Agency (CBSA) designated commercial port-of-entry. Just 45 minutes away, Toronto Pearson International Airport, Canada's largest air transportation hub, provides global connectivity for passengers and freight.
